#### **Scholarships**

Two Delta Kappa Gamma members have received scholarships for Leadership and Professional Development. Thalia Matthews received a scholarship to further her professional knowledge. Nellie Pruitt received a scholarship to help defray costs to the DKG International Convention in Austin, Texas.
